MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

BETWEEN

**DEPARTMENT OF LAND MANAGEMENT
And
DEPARTMENT OF ADMINISTRATION**

This Memorandum of Understanding is entered into by and between the Department of Land Management, hereinafter referred to as DLM, and the Department of Administration, hereinafter referred to as DOA, both existing under and by virtue of Guam law.

This Memorandum of Understanding addresses the conditions under which DLM is authorized to hire a Systems Analyst II position.

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, both entities agree that a well managed Geographic Information System and Land Information System (GIS/LIS) operation is essential and critical to DLM and its clients;

WHEREAS, both entities desire to work closely in concert to ensure successful and smooth operations of the DLM (GIS/LIS);

THEREFORE, in consideration of this memorandum and its purpose, both entities agree as follows:

1. That DLM shall hire personnel pursuant to Public Law 21-42 and supervise one (1) Computer Systems Analyst II to oversee DLM's day to day pursuant to PL 21-42.
2. That DLM shall comply with established GovGuam IT standards and policies as outlined in the Bureau of Information technology website (www.bit.guam.gov)
3. That DLM shall have an updated Continuity of Operations (COOP) and Disaster Recovery Plan.
4. That DOA will provide technical oversight on DLM IT matters pursuant to PL 13-96.

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
5. That any proposed revisions shall be in accordance to the DLM GIS/LIS mandate Public Law 21-42, Section 27, *"One Million Seven Hundred Sixty-four Thousand Five Hundred Sixty-Five Dollars(\$1,764,656.) are appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of Land Management to fund the Geographic Information System and Land Information System (GIS/LIS) Division within the Department of Land Management for the purpose of recording and updating survey data and land documents into a computerized mapping and land graphic data management system. Notwithstanding the limitations in any provision of law, rule or regulation concerning limited term personnel appointments, the Department of Land Management is authorized thirteen (13) additional positions to staff the GIS/LIS Section and is authorized to keep these positions filled, and to use until expended, the funds appropriated in this Section, for this purpose only."*

This Memorandum of Understanding may be revised, amended, or updated by mutual agreement of the parties, provided however, that any proposed changes will not affect DOA's technical oversight of the DLM local area network, pursuant to PL 13-96.

DLM and DOA agree that this Memorandum of Understanding shall be effective _____, and shall remain in effect unless terminated by DLM or DOA upon written notification.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, the parties hereto have executed this Memorandum of Understanding on this 7th day of May, 2008.

Section 4. Appropriation. Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000) are hereby appropriated from the General Fund to the Institute.

Section 5. §§2913.13 and 2913.14 of Title 10, Guam Code Annotated, are repealed and a new §2913.13 is hereby enacted to read:

"§2913.13. Income limitations. The Federal Poverty Income Guidelines shall be used to determine income eligibility for the Medically Indigent Program. In the calculation of income, payments for medical insurance or medicare premiums shall be excluded from income. An individual found ineligible because of the income limitations set out in this §2913.13 prior to its repeal and re-enactment who was paying medical insurance or medicare premiums shall be reevaluated for eligibility from his or her time of application based on the new Guidelines."

AN ACT TO REENACT THE APPROPRIATIONS PROVIDED TO THE EXECUTIVE BRANCH IN FY 1991 TO MAKE THE SAME LEVEL OF APPROPRIATIONS AVAILABLE IN FY 1992, TO PROVIDE CERTAIN ADDITIONAL APPROPRIATIONS AS SPECIFIED, AND TO PROVIDE APPROPRIATIONS TO THE GUAM VISITORS BUREAU, THE GUAM MASS TRANSIT AUTHORITY, AND THE GUAM LEGISLATURE.

CHAPTER I. GENERAL PROVISIONS:

Section 25. Seven Hundred Sixty-three Thousand Seven Hundred Twenty-five Dollars (\$763,725) are appropriated from the General Fund to the Bureau of Planning for the Islandwide Lot Line Mapping and Relational Data Base Project. This appropriation shall be available until expended.

Section 26. Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000) are appropriated from the General Fund to the Territorial Planning Council for its Fiscal Year 1992 operations.

Section 27. One Million Seven Hundred Sixty-four Thousand Five Hundred Sixty-five Dollars (\$1,764,565) are appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of Land Management to fund the Geographic Information System and Land Information System (GIS/LIS) Division within the Department of Land Management for the purpose of recording and updating survey data and land documents into a computerized mapping and land graphic data management system. Notwithstanding the limitations in any provision of law, rule, or regulation concerning limited term personnel appointments, the Department of Land Management is authorized thirteen (13) additional positions to staff the GIS/LIS Section and is authorized to keep these positions filled, and to use until expended, the funds appropriated in this Section, for this purpose only.

Section 28. One Hundred Twenty Thousand Dollars (\$120,000) are appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of Land Management to pay prior year obligations to be expended as follows:

(a) Twenty-one Thousand One Hundred Eighty-Eight Dollars (\$21,188) for retroactive pay owed to former employees for the period from 9/30/88 to 9/30/90.

(b) Ninety-eight Thousand Eight Hundred Twelve Dollars (\$98,812) for FY90 computer hardware/software for the Geographic Information System.

Section 29. Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000) are appropriated from the General Fund to the Guam Police Department to pay prior year obligation for Inmate/Patient billings from Fiscal Year 1988 to Fiscal Year 1990.

Section 30. One Hundred Twenty Thousand Five Hundred Thirty-five Dollars (\$120,535) are appropriated from the General Fund to the Guam State Council on Vocational Education to supplement federal funds and other operational requirements for Fiscal Year 1992.

Section 31. Twenty Four Million One Hundred Eighty Five Thousand Two Hundred Sixty Dollars (\$24,185,260) are appropriated from the General Fund to the Government of Guam Retirement Fund to continue the provisions of:

- (i) the One Thousand Two Hundred Dollar (\$1,200) annuity benefits;
