Dear Mr. Speaker:

Today I have signed Bill No. 1577 into law, with certain item vetos.

These item vetos are necessary. There is no doubt that our economy is in better condition than at any time in our history. Nonetheless, it is critical that we continue to exercise prudence in financial matters and that we prioritize expenditures. The future is filled with unforseen contingencies, a fact we must keep in mind, especially in light of our recent experience with Typhoon Russ and the uncertainties growing out of the Persian Gulf Crisis. Let us be assured that we place our resources in areas which we agree are truly the highest priorities.

My objections to the specific provisions are:

Section 1. The reconstruction of the access road will be funded from sources other than the General Fund so, I have item vetoed this appropriation in its entirety.

Section 10. While this section is of merit, in the spirit of prioritization, it would be better to first assure that many other areas of Guam which do not at this time have any gymnasium facilities at all are addresed. We want to first neet basic recreational needs of all our people. Therefore, I have vetoed this section in its entirety.

Section 11. Agana Heights has one of the best municipal recreation areas. It has a baseball field, new gymnasium, skating rink and basketball court. We have signed many of these improvements into law, but at this time, would like to see resources now go to other municipal recreational areas so

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that all residents may benefit. Therefore, I have item vetoed this appropriation in its entirety in order to have funds available for the other municipalities.

Section 15. The University of Guam will be able to support for this conference without further funding from the General Fund. Therefore, I have item vetoed this appropriation in its entirety.

Section 21. Construction of a new gymnasium can begin in this fiscal year with the amount of \$1,300,000. This is the estimated cost to construct and equip a school gymnasium and should be sufficient for the Tamuning gym. For this reason, I have reduced the appropriation made in Section 21 to One Million Three Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$1,300,000.)

Section 24. Partial funding of operation is all that is necessary for the remainder of this fiscal year. I have reduced the appropriation made in this section to Thirty Thousand Dollars (\$30,000.)

Section 26. Partial funding of operation is all that is necessary for the remainder of this fiscal year. I have reduced the appropriation made in this section to Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000.)

Section 27. The Department of Labor has agreed to defer this training until the next fiscal year. Therefore, I have item vetoed this appropriation.

Section 34. The Department of Agriculture recommends that the Farmer's & Fisherman's Small Loan Revolving Fund be used to carry out the intent of this Section. The current balance in the Fund is approximately \$200,000. Therefore, I have item vetoed this appropriation.

Section 35. The government has resources available to assist victims of exposure to hazardous materials in the Department of Public Health and Social Services. The Public Defender Service Corporation, however, has no legal basis to function in the capacity implied by this appropriation. Therefore, I have item vetoed this appropriation.

Section 36(b). I agree that the positions set forth in Subsection (a) are needed in the Guam Employment Service. However, the Service is funded by the federal government and local funds are not needed for these positions. Therefore, I have item vetoed this appropriation.

Section 41. I have reduced this appropriation to Four Million Dollars (\$4,000,000). Once again I urge the Legislature to consider the CAHAT program proposed by this

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administration to provide affordable housing opportunities to our young families. The Four Million Dollars (\$4,000,000) made available in this provision can assist only 40 to 50 applicants. More than ten times that many could be served through investment of the same amount in the CAHAT program which provides interest subsidies rather than the principal amount of the loan. Rather than continuing to spend millions to help only a few, if we pass CAHAT, we could assist hundreds of our families for the same amount of money. I would like to see the Six Million Dollars that I have reduced this appropriation by devoted to initiating the CAHAT program, and I am looking forward to our families in Guam finally having this important benefit and living in safe and affordable housing. Let us assist anywhere from 500 to 1,000 of our families instead of just a few.

Section 45. The Public Utility Agency of Guam estimates the cost of this project to be Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$500,000); so, I have reduced the appropriation to that amount.

Section 52. Funding from the Guam Visitors Bureau is available for this project. Therefore, I have reduced the funding from the General Fund to \$25,000.

Section 53. Partial funding of the new positions is all that is necessary for the remainder of this fiscal year. I have reduced the appropriation made in this section to Two Hundred Ten Thousand Dollars which is sufficient for the remainder of this year.

Section 73. The Department of Revenue and Taxation has other personnel needs that they determine to be of higher priority. Therefore, I have item vetoed this provision.

Section 81. The pay range assignment given the auxiliary workers in this section is incorrect. Adoption of this Section could result in increasing the salaries of all entry level positions in the government. I have therefore item vetoed the appropriation. The Department will request funding for temporary positions in its supplemental budget request in January. At that time I will request the pay range designation remain at its current level.

Section 93. I have item vetoed this appropriation, not for lack of support for this important research program but because the University of Guam is not the appropriate agency for it. The University has indicated that it is not prepared to administer this program. I believe that the appropriation for this project is more properly made to the Guam Memorial Hospital Authority which is our major medical facilty and can support the research effort as it has done in the past.

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Section 102. The Legislature has created a similar program as this one at the Guam Economic Development Authority. Since no funds have been expended from "nat program, this appears to be a duplication not required at this time. Therefore, I have item vetoed this section.

Section 104. The road improvements required to be made along Blas Street in Mangilao will be funded from a different source. Therefore, I have item vetoed this section.

Section 106. The Department of Land Management already received funding for lease of additional office space and in fact has relocated part of its staff. This is a duplication of a previous appropriation and I have item vetoed it.

Section 108. The organizations in Californian only requested support of Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000), according to CAHA. I have reduced the appropriation in this Section accordingly.

Section 110. This section seeks to provide broad services open to all residents of Guam without standards establishing need. I am given to understand that the legislative intent was for these per diem payments to be available exclusively during a transit period. Unfortunately, the language does not reflect this intent. Rather, it appears to fund an unlimited and open-ended support program. Already, items that could be addressed by this per diem are theoretically covered, either by medical insurance or by existing government support where insurance is lacking. The open-ended nature of the language in this section gives rise to the possibility of unlimited expenditures by this government, especially in cases of severe, lengthy hospitalization. In the absence of language that is clearly a reflection of what the Legislature wishes to do, I must veto this section entirely.

With respect to other provisions of the bill. I urge the Legislature to adopt the impact development charge -- as submitted by the Administration -- as soon as possible. Many of the appropriations made in this measure for infrastructure should be funded from revenues paid by developers. After all, we agree that the purpose of developing our Territory and our resources is to directly benefit -- first and foremost -- the people of our Territory. Let us make this fully a reality. It is estimated that the implementation of our proposal could generate anywhere from \$100 million to \$150 million, based on current estimates of projects coming on line or otherwise proposed.

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As usual, I look forward to working with you and the members of your august body as we strive to improve even further the lives of our dear people of Guam for generations to come.



- 4 the General Fund to the Department of Public Works for the purpose of
- 5 reconstructing the access road from Route 4 to Inarajan Elementary School.
